“Stuff to Bring to Camp”

Remember to pack as lightly as possible.

What To Bring:

- **Sleeping bag** (or twin sheets/covers)
- **Pillow**
- **Bible**
- **Pens or pencils**
- **Clothes for the week**
- **Athletic shoes** (for most activities/ropes course)
- **Sleeping clothes**
- **Swimsuit** (Modest 1-piece or dark t-shirt covering 2-piece...no mid-riffs)
- **Flashlight**
- **Light jacket/sweatshirt**
- **Sunscreen!**
- **Insect repellent**
- **Money for canteen** (cokes/candy/t-shirts/caps/etc.)
- **Camera** (optional)
- **Fishing Equipment** (optional)
- **A great attitude** (not optional)
- **Towel**
- **Soap/Shampoo** (Bodywash products work great)
- **Deodorant**
- **Toothbrush/toothpaste**
- **Flip/flops** (for showers)

What **NOT** To Bring:

- **Makeup of any kind**
- **Hair-dryers or hair-straighteners**
- **Nice clothes**
- **Jewelry**
- **Cell phone***
- **iPod/music/video players***
- **Weapons/knives***
- **Alcohol/drugs****
- **Tobacco products of any kind****

When we get to camp, we don't like to be "rule-heavy." We want students to come home thinking about experiences and relationships, not about how ruthlessly the rules were enforced.
